Buddhists Believe in the cycle of life, death, and rebirth. It's called Saṃsāra life after death (What kind of life should you pursue after death?) 31 bhūmis

You have

1. 5 Gatis = Deva gati, Manussa gati, Niraya gati, Peta gati, and Tiracchana gati

Gati encompasses the path, destiny, or existence that individuals must navigate after death, determined by their deeds. It also denotes in Pāli *bhūmi* or *loka*, which can be understood as realm or plane where one may be reborn.

- (1) Sugati = Good Path = Good Destiny = Good Existence
 - (1) Kāma Deva loka 6

Cātumahārajika, Tāvatimsā, Yamā, Tusitā, Nimmānarati, Parnimmitavasavattī

- (2) Manussa loka 1
 - 1+2=7 Kāma Sugati bhūmi where can be reborn by doing *Dāna and Sila*.
- (3) Brahma Deva loka 20

16 Rupa loka + 4 Arupa loka only by practicing *Samatha Bhāvanā* (meditation) by *Samatha* you can attain 4 Jhānas, and bacsed on your Jhāna level you can be reborn in one of 20

- (2) Dugati = Bad Paths = Niraya, Peta, and Tiracchāna by doing bad deeds
 4 Apāya bhūmis = 4 Woeful States
 Niraya (Hell), Peta (Hungry Ghosts), Asurakāya (Titans), Tiracchāna (Animals)
- 2. 3 bhūmis = Ti-bhūmi = Three Existences Kāma 11, Rupa 16 and Arupa 4 = 31 bhūmis
- 3. Lokuttara = Vimutti = Emancipation 4 Magga and 4 Phala = Nibbāna liberation from the sufferings associated with traversing the 31 bhūmis
